




With risk surfacing everywhere around us, it's useful to have some cues about what's worth exploring. Here are our suggestions.

We Do This 'Til We Free Us: Abolitionist Organizing and Transforming Justice by Mariame Kaba is a collection of essays and interviews reflecting on the deep work of abolition and transformative political struggle.

<u>Silicon Values: The Future of Free Speech under Surveillance Capitalism</u> by Jillian C. York looks at how our rights have become increasingly undermined by major corporations' desire to harvest our personal data and turn it into profit.

## FILMS






